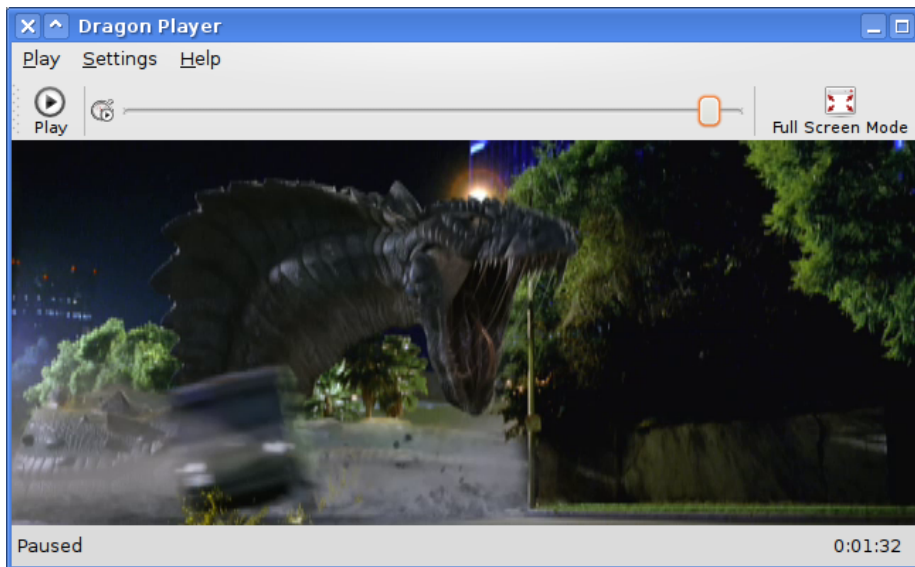

# Menu and Command Reference

### 2.1 The Play Menu

**Play** → **Play Media... (Ctrl-O)** Opens the Play Media dialog, allowing you to Play a DVD, VCD or a video file.

**Play** → **Play/Pause (Space)** If a movie is loaded, this option allows you to pause and resume playback.

**Play** → **Stop (S)** If a movie is loaded, this option allows you to stop playback.

**Play** → **Quit (Ctrl-Q)** Quits Dragon Player.

### 2.2 The Settings Menu

**Settings** → **Full Screen Mode (F)** While playing a movie, you can enter full screen mode. This uses the entire monitor to display the movie

**Settings** → **Aspect Ratio** This menu lets you pick the aspect ratio of the playing movie. The aspect ratio is width of movie compared to the height.

**Settings** → **Subtitles** This menu is active if there are any subtitles available from the currently playing movie. Note that it may take a few seconds of playback before the subtitles become available.

**Settings** → **Audio Channels** This menu is active if there are any additional audio channels available. For instance, some DVDs have additional languages. Note that it may take a few seconds of playback before the audio channels become available.

**Settings** → **Menu Toggle (R)** To be written

**Settings** → **Videosettings** To be written

**Settings** → **Configure Shortcuts...** Allows you to configure the Dragon Player shortcuts.

**Settings** → **Configure Toolbars...** Allows you to configure what buttons are available on the toolbar.

**Settings** → **Show Toolbar** Enables or disable the main application toolbar.

### 2.3 The Help Menu

**Help** → **Dragon Player Handbook (F1)** Invokes the KDE Help system starting at the Dragon Player help pages. (this document).

**Help** → **What's This? (Shift+F1)** Changes the mouse cursor to a combination arrow and question mark. Clicking on items within Dragon Player will open a help window (if one exists for the particular item) explaining the item's function.

**Help** → **Report Bug...** Opens the Bug report dialog where you can report a bug or request a 'wishlist' feature.

**Help** → **Switch Application Language...** Opens a dialog where you can edit the Primary language and Fallback language for this application.

**Help** → **About Dragon Player** This will display version and author information.

**Help** → **About KDE** This displays the KDE version and other basic information.
